In Math: All students demonstrate growth and score Proficient or higher in Math on the Georgia Milestones EOG and EOC tests.

In Literacy: All students demonstrate growth in reading and writing and score Proficient or higher on the Georgia Milestones EOG and EOC tests.

Behavior: Increase Climate Star Rating scores by implementing Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) and reducing office discipline referrals.

In Math- Our focus will be on building students' number sense.

In Literacy- Our focus will be on preparing students to read and write fluently.

Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

In the First Grade

Teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of the ways we will accomplish this include:

- Encourage parents to read daily with their child and ask questions.
- Help students understand facts before memorizing.
- Provide parent resources/trainings in math and reading through parent events and the PIRC and online websites.
- Provide sight words for home use.
- Stay in communication with parents through weekly folders.

At Home

PES parents worked with staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math at home. Some of the suggestions:

- Read all book genres to students daily and discuss.
- Attend parent activities or access information from the events on the school website (online access in the PIRC or public library).

- Stay informed with monthly newsletter, Parent Inv., Remind, email and school lobby.
- Communicate with teachers through conferences and weekly folders.
- Sight word list & vocab, 10 minutes ORF practice.

1st Grade Students

A sampling of Pelham Elementary School students were asked their ideas about how they can succeed in Math and Literacy. Students thought of the following ways to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Practice addition and subtraction facts, counting, and skip counting.
- Practice sight words.
- Use Istation at home.
- Read with parent or adult daily.
- Play math and reading games at home to build skills.
